Making model trees with wire

(A tale of a tree)

here's a preview of what you'll get at the finish line




some of the tree branches have been cut off



a solitary tree seen from a distance




start by getting some thin wire



The thickness of the wire depends on the scale you are using and the material you have on hand.

Experiment and you'll find out yourself what goes better!

tie the wires close together with some textile fiber



Group some wires and tie these close together as seen above.

Keep in mind that you should have enough wires to form the branches and the trunk.


burn the insulator layer



This is an important step. If you skip it, you might not be able to paint the branches later.

Be careful not to melt the thin wires!

twist some smaller branches



Twist some thinner wire together to make the smaller branches.


and one more branch



As for the number of minor branches, that really depends on the kind of tree you are modeling.

Just trust your imagination (or use a real tree model).

glue the branches to the trunk



Use a very quick drying glue. Also, you can use some textile fiber to tie everything together.

arrange the tree to look nice and round



The shape of the tree top depends on what kind of tree you are trying to make. You should have an appropriate picture with a tree to use it as a model. at this point, we should have something similar to what can be seen in the picture below



the bark





Mix together some white plaster, glue, and a little water.

Add a bit of color (not too much, it will darken when drying, and you can paint some more then, if you like).

apply the mixture on the tree



the foliage (1)



What I used here is foliage produced by noch.de, but you can use whatever you have around.

It can also be house made (in the next e-book on that).

the foliage (2)



Add some glue on the branches, then spread the foliage.

The photo with the real tree might help here, too;)

this is what we have up to this point



All that is left to be done is the cut branches (remember page 3?)

the cut branches



Using some abrasive paper, rub off some of the plaster, in appropriate places.

You should get a flat surface, looking as if the branch was cut. Paint it with a toothpick soaked in paint.
